# Last Week's Highlights

#### Monday

In Reading last week, students enjoyed the story <u>From Places We Go.</u> We read about places we might find in our community. We learned that informational text gives us facts and details that support the main idea.

#### Tuesday

We continue to work with our academic vocabulary for Unit One – affect, different, compare, location, and region. This week we used context clues, other words in the sentence, to help us understand the meaning of these words.

#### Wednesday

Last week we practiced consonant blends. Some words had two consonant blends (frog, nest), some words had triple consonant blends (strong, spring), and some words had blends at the beginning and end (spend).

#### Thursday

In Math we started Module Two: Addition and Subtraction of Length Units. We have been talking about units of measure and using our centimeter ruler to measure objects. We also learned about a meter stick. It is 100 cm long!

#### Friday

We have been practicing our lowercase handwriting. It's important to form the letters correctly so we will be ready to start cursive later.
